

LET'S MAKE ONLINE SAFE

KEEP PRIVATE

Manage privacy settings in each application, often applications default to public and don't take into account a child's need for privacy. Keep those personal photos and exciting life events for close family & friends.



REMAIN TOP SECRET

Limit personal information; never give away your personal address, phone number or name of school. Treat people online that you have never met before the same way you would if you met a stranger on the street.



AVOID LOCATION UPDATES

While it might be fun to check-in with your exact location while doing something cool that you want to share, it's also very risky. Not only does it tell people that you are not home, it also gives them your exact location.



STOP FAKING IT

Just because something is posted online does not make it real news. Check that the source is credible and that the information matches multiple sources. Think critically about what you read online.



PRACTICE KINDNESS

Being a good digital citizen is about being kind online; practice empathy and be a good listener and observer.



BE SELECTIVE

Only accept friend requests online from people that you know in the offline world.
